Society for Humanistic Anthropology

Humanistic anthropology involves the recognition that professional inquiry takes place in a context of human value. The humanistic orientation is particularly concerned with the personal, ethical, and political choices facing humans. It celebrates that human reality is something on which we creative primates can have real effects: we can change our social and physical environment. Accordingly, it recognizes that anthropological inquiry constitutes a part of that work, particularly in promoting multicultural understanding and revealing the social blockages that are deleterious to our social and physical environment. Humanistic anthropology does not stand in opposition to scientific anthropology, but it does demand of science a human dimension.

The Society for Humanistic Anthropology was founded in 1974 to open a dialogue on the various means by which anthropologists might evoke, represent, or give account of the human subject. Members of the Society receive ***Anthropology and Humanism***, which publishes essays, narratives, dramas, poems, translations, drawings, and photographs twice yearly.

The Society gives three annual awards in writing: **The Victor Turner Prize for Ethnographic Writing** is given for published books in various genres, including ethnographic monographs, narratives, essays, biographies, memoirs, poetry and drama; the annual **Poetry Prize** and **Fiction Prize** are awarded to works in their

respective genres, generally shorter works, which are then published in *Anthropology and Humanism*.

Notes on AAA Membership Categories

¹ **Student:** verification of current student status is required for student membership. Give the name of the institution, and program and degree being pursued:

² **Joint:** available to the spouse/partner of a Member who pays dues at full rate. Joint Members do not receive publications. If remitting at the joint rate, please give the name of the Member, and the member's 7-digit AAA ID#:

³ **Associate:** only available to persons whose interest is strictly avocational and who do not derive income from anthropological activities. Please list your position and employer:

(Consulting anthropologists are ineligible for Associate status. Associate members can hold elective offices, but have nonvoting status in the Association.)

⁴ **Retired:** available to any individual who has been an active AAA member for at least 20 years and who has either reached the age of 65 or has retired status in one's institution.

⁵ **International:** available only to permanent residents of a country other than the US. Residents of "A" countries pay dues of \$95 for Basic Membership. The following have been designated as "A" countries: Australia, Bahrain, Bermuda, Brunei, Canada, Cyprus, Hong Kong, Israel, Japan, Kuwait, Libya, New Caledonia, New Zealand, Qatar, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, United Arab Emirates, Western European countries, and staff of the UN, USAID, Peace Corps, or similar organizations. Residents of all other countries ("B") pay basic membership dues of \$30.
